


General Manager's Monthly Bulletin February 2022

Transparency Certificate of Excellence Awarded to District

This month, Ross Valley Sanitary District's application for the District Transparency Certificate of Excellence was approved by the <u>Special District Leadership Foundation</u> (SDLF). This certificate recognizes RVSD as a District that promotes transparency in its operations and governance. Redwood Empire Section Supervisor of the Year Award

<u>John Vogel</u>, RVSD's Condition Assessment Supervisor, received the <u>California Water Environment Association</u> (CWEA) Redwood Empire Section Supervisor of the Year Award. This award recognizes wastewater professionals throughout Lake, Marin, Napa, Sonoma, and part of Mendocino and Solano County. John's nomination will move forward for consideration at the state level. The award ceremony will take place on Friday, April 8.

CWEA mission is empowering, educating and connecting water professionals to protect public health and the environment. CWEA provides wastewater professionals with valuable certifications, training, and networking opportunities.







2022 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Planning Update

As we complete our remaining Capital Improvement Program projects from last year, planning and design for future projects is underway. These include improvements to Lift Station 20 off E Sir Francis Drake Blvd (across from the Larkspur Ferry Terminal). The design plan for this project calls for electrical upgrades and installing a new wet well.

Design is also underway for the FY 2022/23 Gravity Sewer Improvements Project to replace existing gravity sewer lines throughout the District service area. Improvements include upsizing a 6-inch sewer line to 8-inches for capacity on The Alameda in San Anselmo and similar upgrades will occur on South Ridgewood at Woodland in Kent Woodlands.

Upgrades are also being planned on Deer Hollow in Sleepy Hollow, an easement in Vista Grande in Greenbrae, and an easement that

includes a creek crossing in Kent Woodlands. These lines were prioritized in our system-wide risk assessment under our <u>2021 Infrastructure Asset Management Plan</u> (IAMP). Stay tuned for more information as each of these projects develop.

2021-22 CIP Project Progress Report Updates

Butterfield/Arroyo-Kenrick Gravity Sewer Improvements: Project construction is complete. Paving work on Fawn Drive is scheduled to occur March 7 and 8. Any additional updates or notices will be provided in advance. Visit the <u>project webpage</u> for more information.

FY 2020/21 Gravity Sewer Improvements

Work in Sequoia Park (San Anselmo) is now wrapping up. The last remaining area of work is a short section on Skyland Way in Ross. Work on this section began in February (see photo). Visit the <u>project</u> webpage for more information.

Larkspur Pump Stations 14, 24, & 25 Improvements

Project construction is anticipated to begin mid-March. Delays have occurred due to supply chain issues. Visit the <u>project webpage</u> updates.

Larkspur Landing

Cleanup activities are complete at the Larkspur Landing former treatment plant site (see photo) as required by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). In December 2021, EPA approved the cleanup of the Larkspur Landing property for unrestricted land use, meaning that the property is suitably clean for all potential land uses with no exceptions. 


EPA approval enables the District to continue with community outreach to help determine future uses of the property. Between now and March 10, 2022, the District invites ratepayers and interested parties to complete a community survey to provide input on the disposition of this property, should the Board determine that any portion of it is surplus to its operations. A special meeting of the Board is scheduled for Wednesday, March 30 to receive the results of the community survey. The information for this meeting will be posted on the Larkspur Landing web page.
